A A E 334: The Environment and the Global Economy

Tabled on 12-18-12 to receive additional information from department. Changing course number and description. "At the 300-level, the course has attracted advanced undergraduates, including many Economics majors. It is taught at the elementary level, so we are lowering the number to signal that it is not appropriate for seniors in Economics, for example."

Biochem. 704: Chemical Biology

Accordingly, the course is appropriately cross-listed in the chemistry department. This cross listing doesn't really change anything; it just acknowledges that this course has become a requirement for chemical biology majors in the Department of Chemistry."
