- Difference between Plant Path 311 and this course is the focus on small holder farming
- Overlap with Plant Path 311 is not an issue since this is a one credit course and does not cover the topics in the same detail
- Broad title is intended to attract students from a variety of majors and backgrounds
- Suggestion to change title to "Family Farms Feed the World," or "Small Holder Farms Drive Food Security," or "Livestock Farms Drive Food Security"
